Christians do not prostrate on Sunday because this is the day we always celebrate the Resurrection, and we recall how God is able to make us stand. Our standing reminds us of the resurrection. There are one or two Sundays a year when we do prostrate (the Third Sunday of Great Lent (Veneration of the Cross), and the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, if it falls on a Sunday. On this day, the hymn "Before Thy cross", which we sing while prostration, teaches us what our prostrations mean:

# Before Thy Cross, we fall down in worship, O Master, and Thy holy Resurrection we glorify.

When we prostrate, it is in worship of the Risen Lord, and when we raise ourselves up, we recall the resurrection.

A Christian prostrates when he makes the sign of the cross, and falls to his hands and knees (it is usually easier to have the hands touch the floor a moment before the knees), and bows his head to the ground, then gets back up. (orthodox.net)

# **BEING ALONE vs. BEARING MUCH FRUIT**

(Sunday, March 19)—from Coffee with Sister Vassa

"And he called to him the multitude with his disciples, and said to them, 'If any man wants to come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me. For whoever would save his life/soul (τὴν ψυχὴν αὐτοῦ) will lose it; and whoever loses his life/soul for my sake and the gospel's will save it. For what does it profit a man, to gain the whole world and forfeit his life/soul? For what can a man give in return for his life/soul?" (Mk 8: 34-37)

This doesn't make much sense, this talk about "losing" my "life/soul" in order to "save" it, – does it? Well, it does, if I remember that our Lord distinguishes between two kinds of "life/soul": 1. the kind we all have whether we want it or not, just by being born of our physical parents; and 2. The kind we can embrace "if we want to come after Him," denying a self-isolated existence outside of Him, and joining Him on the life-giving journey of the Cross. "Truly, truly, I say to you," He says on another occasion, "unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains alone; but if it dies, it bears much fruit. He who loves his life/soul loses it, and he who hates his life/soul in this world will keep it for eternal life." (Jn 12: 24-25)

So let me join Him today, once again, on the cross-carrying adventure that brings me Life with a capitol "L." Let me "lose" the self-centeredness and self-seeking that aims, quite pointlessly, "to gain the whole world." I rather take up my cross today, walking through my immediate responsibilities, as He calls me to, in my here and now. God sends me this cross, which "saves" or "heals" my "life/soul," as He sees fit. "Thy will be done" with me today, O Lord, that I not "remain alone," but "bear much fruit."
