The Soul: How our soul differs from that of an animal

The Orthodox Church teaches that animals have souls, although not the same as ours. When conceived, God bestows upon us the nous, which distinguishes us from the other animals. It is the nous that is the eye of the soul, intelligent and noetic, and by nature designed to commune with God. The nous is the center of man and is where true (spiritual) knowledge is validated.

Just as we are being redeemed and transformed, so is the entire cosmos. Animals are a part of this cosmos that is being prepared for the eternal Kingdom that will have no end.

The kind treatment of animals reflects in an iconic way the truth that in Paradise God has called us to name our animals as Adam did, and live in communion with them. Saint Seraphim of Sarov even befriended wild bears.

God's Patience with Sinners

The Lord God is patient. God waits for sinners to repent. God's love for sinners continues even when sinners are recalcitrant. The opportunity to repent always exists.

God is ready to welcome the returning sinner. New beginnings and a new life in Christ are possible. The desire for wholeness and healing in Christ foster repentance.

God heals the broken-hearted. God alleviates the deepest hurt. The tarnished soul is cleansed by God's purifying love. Being mindful of God's healing power makes a difference.

Persons stressed by the press of sins and turmoil in life find peace in the Lord Jesus Christ. Jesus said: "Take my yoke upon you, and learn of me; for I am meek and lowly in heart: and ye shall find rest unto your souls." (Mt.11:29)

Believers may struggle with the same inclinations to sin over a period of time. Frustration may set in. Hope may fade that the certain inclinations to sin will ever be defeated.

The Lord strengthens believers to continue to fight against sin. Believers are encouraged to regularly repent and begin anew in Christ. With each new beginning, the battle can continue to be waged.

Evil is successful only when the believer yields to despair. There is reason to hope as long as the believer is willing to sincerely fight against sin. Victory with Christ is possible.

Relief and joy come from the Lord's love and forgiveness. Hope is strengthened and renewed when God's forgiveness is received and appreciated.

True repentance makes a decided difference in the most serious of sinners.

The lives of the saints reveal the positive changes occurring when sin is rejected and Christ is fully embraced. Saint Mary of Egypt and Saint Moses the Black are two examples of repentance resulting in radically changed lives.

Danger exists in taking God's patience for granted and procrastinating. Repentance needs to occur throughout life. Life's fullness is experienced when lived in Christ.



Has the Lord closed any of His "doors" to us? No. In fact, in these weeks leading up to Lent, we're repeatedly reminded of how willingly He exchanges "house-visits" even with the "worst" of us, whenever we open up to Him, in repentance. Two weekends ago, we heard about Zacchaeus, a tax collector who scrambled up into a tree to catch a glimpse of Christ, from afar, – and the Lord rewarded his humble efforts by visiting his house. Last weekend, we celebrated another tax-collector, somewhat bolder than Zacchaeus, who "went up" not into a tree, to see the Lord from afar, but into the very house of the Lord, "into the temple," to pray (Lk 18:10). And he, too, was rewarded with a "house visit" by God's grace: For the humble, sincere way in which he prayed, he was rewarded with "going home" not empty-handed, but with the great blessing of being "justified" (Lk 18: 14). And this past weekend, we celebrated the Prodigal Son's return to his Father's house, the doors of which had never been closed to him.

The Lenten hymn quoted above, which we'll be singing every weekend until the end of Lent, captures our attitude, as Church, to this "open door policy" we have with our Lord. We need His help, to keep it going. Because, while we know His doors are always open, ours tend to get stuck in forgetfulness or neglect, and occasionally need some oil on their hinges. So we ask for His "oil," for His grace, to help us open up again to His transfigurative fellowship, with which He challenges us again and again. "Open to me the doors of repentance, O Lifegiver," because I'm ready, Lord. I'm ready for repentance, and for the beautiful Season of Positive Change, which is Lent! Sister Vassa [Larin]
