#### **Praise the Lord from the heavens! Praise Him in the highest!**

Our life ship throws in the waves of life. A large percentage of family ships that sail into the sea, while the first minor storm break into stones of our pride, intolerance and arbitrariness, tolerate full crash. Today's reading of the gospel reveals to us true that Christ is near. Each of us depends on whether the Lord will enter our ship. Modern dictates to us that people's relationship starts not with the temple, but from the bedroom. A number of theories that the world offers us say we have a partner picking up, how to pick up in the market product: by size, fashion, etc. About, the storm can only calm down when Christ comes into our family ship. We are scared, we do not know what will happen when Christ approaches, because we often do not know him. But the Lord says to us, "This is me, do not be afraid!" (More. 19:20). He calms us down, saying not to fear, open your heart, bring tears of repentance, in the end, change your life. He addresses us, "Watch not about the food that perishes, but the food that remains for eternal life that the Son of Man will give us." (More. 19:23). The Lord comes, open your house to him and may forever be with us. Amen.

Often we confuse things and think that spiritual life means being a good person, not stealing, killing, walking in bad places, and having bad friends, going to church on Sunday, being there for praise, or at least "Blessed is the Kingdom of Father and Son and the Holy Spirit," to read Christian literature.

## **Giving Thanks to God**

# Psalm 18:49-Therefore will I give thanks unto thee, O Lord, among the heathen, and sing praises unto thy name. (KJV)

Every moment of every day is an opportunity for believers to give thanks to God. Many ways exist for believers to thank God and they need not be ostentatious. ### **The Sunday of the Myrrhbearers** Mark 15:43-16:8

Joseph of Arimathaea, an honourable counsellor, which also waited for the kingdom of God, came, and went in boldly unto Pilate, and craved the body of Jesus. And Pilate marvelled if he were already dead: and calling unto him the centurion, he asked him whether he had been any while dead. And when he knew it of the centurion, he gave the body to Joseph. And he bought fine linen, and took him down, and wrapped him in the linen, and laid him in a sepulchre which was hewn out of a rock, and rolled a stone unto the door of the sepulchre. And Mary Magdalene and Mary the mother of Joses beheld where he was laid. And when the sabbath was past, Mary Magdalene, and Mary the mother of James, and Salome, had bought sweet spices, that they might come and anoint him. And very early in the morning the first day of the week, they came unto the sepulchre at the rising of the sun. And they said among themselves, Who shall roll us away the stone from the door of the sepulchre? And when they looked, they saw that the stone was rolled away: for it was very great. And entering into the sepulchre, they saw a young man sitting on the right side, clothed in a long white garment; and they were affrighted. And he saith unto them, Be not affrighted: Ye seek Jesus of Nazareth, which was crucified: he is risen; he is not here: behold the place where they laid him. But go your way, tell his disciples and Peter that he goeth before you into Galilee: there shall ye see him, as he said unto you. And they went out quickly, and fled from the sepulchre; for they trembled and were amazed: neither said they any thing to any man; for they were afraid. (KJV)

God's Holy Church continues to joyfully celebrate the Lord Jesus Christ's Resurrection. The celebration continues daily until the Feast of the Ascension. The Church wants believers to be completely focused on Christ's Resurrection.

Each year believers are expected to prepare during Great Lent for the arrival of Holy Week and the celebration of Jesus' Resurrection. Great Lent is a time to focus on repentance and renewal of life in Jesus Christ.

Jesus Christ's Resurrection brings the greatest of joy. The women going to the tomb as described in St. Mark's Gospel heard the words: "He is Risen!". Believers greet each other with same words during this period following Pascha.

Hristos Voskrese! Christ is Risen! Vaistinu Voskrese! Indeed He is Risen!

Hearts are filled with joy in these greetings. Believers unite in celebrating the Lord's Resurrection.

The believer's world has changed. Death is no longer a threat. Death no longer has a foreboding grip on life. Jesus Christ conquered death. Jesus Christ triumphed over death.

The myrrhbearing women were witnesses to the Empty Tomb. The women heard the message directly when they came to the Tomb. The joyous proclamation of Jesus' Resurrection has continued for more than twenty centuries.

Wars, epidemics and tyrannical governments have not been able to silence the message that "Christ is Risen!". This year when a pandemic virus threatened to quarantine large portions of the world, Pascha continued to be celebrated.

In countries where Communism once reigned and efforts to stamp out the Church were extensive, believers found ways to celebrate Christ's Resurrection.

Death can bring sadness. Christ's Resurrection brings joy!
Believers are to deeply savor the meaning of Jesus Christ rising from the dead. The enduring hope established by the Risen Christ cannot be extinguished.

Resurrection joy cannot be stifled.

When the heart hurts, when depression threatens, Christ's Resurrection triumphs and lifts the faithful believer to new heights. The women going to Christ's Tomb had their lives changed forever.

Believers having seriously invested in Great Lent experience proportionate joy in celebrating Christ's Resurrection. This year was certainly unusual due to restrictions on worship.

The ability to pray at home or wherever a believer is located is always possible. God is everywhere and is immediately accessible to persons of faith. Serious Christians find ways to be united with the Lord God.

Serious believers do not yield to foreboding predictions. Strength is drawn from the martyrs and the saints through the centuries. The Church has a long list of examples of faithful believers remaining steadfast in periods of great hardship.

The current pandemic will pass. The present restrictions will eventually be lifted. Every person has the opportunity at every moment of time to reach out in faith to the Lord God.

Every believer has the freedom to say "Christ is Risen!" from the depths of the believing and joyful heart. The proclamation that "Christ is Risen" heals the broken hearted and dispels feelings of gloom and depression.

God's churches are bright with the joy of the Resurrection. The Gospel messages communicate hope and joy. Clergy wear bright vestments. Cantors and choirs sing joyful verses to enlighten the world.



REMINDERS: <u>NO KNEELING</u> until the Kneeling Prayers of Pentecost Sunday. Instead of "Vechnaya Pam'yat" at the end of a Parastas or during a funeral service *until Ascension Thursday*, we sing "Christ is Risen!" Also, we do not say the prayer to the Holy Spirit "O Heavenly King" until Pentecost Sunday.
