NOTHING FROM OUTSIDE CAN DEFILE US Sister Vassa Larin (Wednesday, September 16)

"When he had called all the multitude to himself, he said to them, 'Hear me, everyone, and understand: There is nothing that enters a man from outside which can defile him; but the things which come out of him, those are the things that defile a man. If anyone has ears to hear, let him hear!' When he had entered a house away from the crowd, his disciples asked him concerning the parable. So he said to them, 'Are you thus without understanding also? Do you not perceive that whatever enters a man from outside cannot defile him, because it does not enter his heart but his stomach, and is eliminated, thus purifying all foods?' And he said, 'What comes out of a man, that defiles a man. For from within, out of the heart of men, proceed evil thoughts, adulteries, fornications, murders...'" (Mk 7: 14-20)

...Lest I think that I must be a "victim" of those things that "enter" me "from outside." No, I only fall prey to the "bad" things that I sometimes "eat," be they certain foods, – or indeed words, or images, or melodies, – if I embrace them in my heart, with a heartfelt attachment to them, and hence re-produce them from there, letting them "come out" of me, in my own actions and words.

Let me guard my heart today, by re-connecting with God in some heartfelt prayer. Similarly to the "bad" things, which can "defile" me only if

I embrace them in my heart, so does the "good" thing of God's grace elevate and enlighten me, when I let it into my heart. "Come and abide in us, and cleanse us from all impurity, and save our souls, O Good One!"

We need each other, and we work out our salvation together.
"Bill interjected, "I don't go to church to relate with others, I go to receive the sacrament. Receiving Christ feeds my prayer life, makes me feel closer to him. It helps me to keep up my devotions throughout the week."

"I think part of the reason you say this, Bill, is that you're missing a crucial dimension of what the eucharist is about," Father answered. "The Liturgy is not a 'me and Jesus' phenomenon. The eucharist ushers in the kingdom of God and makes us its citizens. Here we willingly enter into a relationship with God and with each other through the command of Christ and his mediation. This transcends and supersedes every separation and division—a challenge for us all, for Christ says, 'Love one another as I have loved you.' Isn't it remarkable that we become mostly truly who we are by giving ourselves entirely to others! That's the only way we can become most fully ourselves. The sacraments feed our union and make it visible in the assembly where we partake of them.

Many of us still don't understand that this worship is more than just 'me and Jesus'; after all, no one can 'muster up' the eucharist alone; it's interpersonal, 'we together' who are shown how expansive the mystery of Christ is. Again, it's beyond anything we could achieve alone."

New in Christ

Romans 6:4-Therefore we are buried with him by baptism into death: that like as Christ was raised up from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life. (KJV)

The Christian identity begins at Baptism and is to be honored throughout life. Believers begin the new life in Christ at Holy Baptism and are forever changed. The identity change occurring at Baptism is permanent for life's remaining days. Serious Christians measure all

thoughts and actions with Jesus Christ's teachings. The heart, mind and soul consciously quide the believer in following Jesus Christ.

The Fifteen Sunday after Pentecost Matthew 22:35-46
Then one of them, which was a lawyer, asked Him a question, tempting Him, and saying, Master, which is the great commandment in the law? Jesus said unto him, Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart,

and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind. This is the first and great commandment. And the second is like unto it, Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself. On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets. While the Pharisees were gathered together, Jesus asked them, Saying, What think ye of Christ? whose son is he? They say unto him, The son of David. He saith unto them, How then doth David in spirit call him Lord, saying, The Lord said unto my Lord, Sit thou on my right hand, till I make thine enemies thy footstool? If David then call him Lord, how is he his son? And no man was able to answer Him a word, neither durst any man from that day forth ask Him any more questions. (KJV)

The Sunday before the Exaltation of the Precious Cross John 3:13-17 And no man hath ascended up to heaven, but he that came down from heaven, even the Son of man which is in heaven. And as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, even so must the Son of man be lifted up: That whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have eternal life. For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that

whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life. For God sent not his Son into the world to condemn the world; but that the world through him might be saved. KJV)

St. John's Gospel reading for today states Jesus came into the world to save the world. Believers are required to take action to be saved. Willingness to adhere to Christ's teachings is necessary.

Temptations and perils exist that endanger believers' souls. The Lord Jesus Christ said: "Strait is the gate, and narrow is the way, which leadeth unto life, and few there be that find it." (Mt.7:14)

The Lord Jesus Christ's commandments are clear in the Gospel: "Love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind" and "Love thy neighbour as thyself." (Mt.22:37-39)
