### **The Sunday of the Publican and Pharisee** Luke 18:10-14

Two men went up into the temple to pray: the one a Pharisee, and the other a publican. The Pharisee stood and prayed thus with himself, God, I thank thee, that I am not as other men are, extortioners, unjust, adulterers, or even as this publican. I fast twice in the week, I give tithes

of all that I possess. And the publican, standing afar off, would not lift up so much as his eyes unto heaven, but smote upon his breast, saying, God be merciful to me a sinner. I tell you, this man went down to his house justified rather than the other: for every one that exalteth himself shall be abased; and he that humbleth himself shall be exalted. (KJV)

Today believers have the opportunity to seek unity with the Lord God. This opportunity exists when the believer becomes like the publican in the current Gospel. The publican humbly sought the Lord's mercy.

The publican did not exalt himself. He did not boast nor tell God all the good he had done. The publican recognized and took responsibility for his own sinfulness.

Courage, faith, and trust in the Lord God are necessary to come before God and acknowledge personal sinfulness. Every person commits sins. Only the Lord Jesus Christ is perfect.

When believers acknowledge personal sins, repent, and seek the Lord's mercy, new beginnings in life occur. The Pharisee boasted to God about what he considered to be good. The Pharisee looked down upon the publican.

Love for the publican was absent in the Pharisee. Acknowledging personal sin, humility and repentance were absent in the Pharisee. The Pharisee did not seek to change and lead a more God-pleasing life.

The Pharisee determined he had done enough for God. The Pharisee did not view God-pleasing growth as a continuous process until departure from this life.

Christians are to seek growth from Holy Baptism until departure from this life.

The possibility to grow in Christ and be renewed in Christ exists throughout life. The Holy Apostle Paul's Epistle to the Corinthians describes the unlimited change possible for believers.

The Holy Apostle Paul stated: "But we all, with open face beholding as in a glass the gloryof the Lord, are changed into the same image from glory to glory, even as by the Spirit of the Lord." (2 Cor. 3:18)

Change by the Spirit of the Lord requires humility and personal understanding of sin. Change in the believer to the image of the Lord necessitates sin being expelled from personal life.

The publican desired the Lord's mercy. The publican wanted his life to change and become pleasing to the Lord. Arrogance and pride were absent in the publican. The publican was sorry for his sins.

God's goodness and mercy are everywhere. The humble see God at work in everyday life and at every moment of life. The arrogant and prideful Pharisee sees only himself and what he considers his own good.

The Pharisee was blinded to his own sin. The Pharisee was content with the way he lived. The Pharisee did not see the need to change. His heart was hardened and his mind was closed.

The publican felt in his soul the need for change. The publican yearned for the Lord's mercy to make a difference in his life. The publican's yearning for God was recognized.

The Gospel is clear in saying the publican is the example to follow to lead a God-pleasing life. God's Holy Church prescribes this Gospel to be read each year as Great Lent approaches.

Believers are to look carefully within the heart, mind, and soul. Pharisaic attitudes are to be immediately rejected with God's help. The humility of the publican is to become real in the believer's heart, mind, and soul.

Repentance involves a change in the heart, mind and soul. Love of God increases as the believer becomes more aware of God in personal and daily life.

Room is required in the heart, mind, and soul to see, love and experience God.

Great Lent redirects the believer to a life more pleasing to God. The Lenten journey in God's Holy Church is a journey of love and of the life in Christ. The Lenten journey is gentle, life-changing and life-renewing.

Believers are to welcome the desired change in the spirit of Great Lent. Joy is manifested and experienced among believers seeking to grow in Christ. The publican is the example of an open heart and love for the Lord Jesus Christ.



Jawn, pronounced \'jän\, is the Philadelphia all-purpose noun. It can refer to a single thing, or a collection or class of things, or a situation, or a person.

This past weekend, our family became part of the 53%.

We rescued a dog.

Tennille (Like Captain and Tennille) is two-year old mutt. She has some Shepherd in her, that's for sure. Maybe some Lab? Maybe some cattle dog? It's hard to tell, but her quirks tell us she is a little bit of all three. She's 35 pounds and all white, with these pointy ears that are always at attention, even when she is sleeping.

She likes to burrow in the snow. She meticulously hides her bone so she can find it the next day. She brings us presents, like our slippers, dish towels, and a boot. She loves to "wrastle" and bark at dogs from our bay window. She would prefer that we're all in the same room. She is very well behaved and listens way better than we could have ever hoped, even though we're pretty sure she has no idea what her name is. In fact, in a little under the week, we've pretty much changed her name to Tenny. She doesn't seem to mind.

Tenny was rescued as a stray somewhere down South. She was pregnant. While she was being fostered, she gave birth to 14 puppies. We're told she was a very attentive mother, which makes sense. The other night, our 4-year-old took a bit of a spill down the steps and Tenny was there by her side before we even got there. The instinct is strong with this one.

Tenny is very tolerant with our little one. (When do we get to stop calling them "our little ones?" Never? Good.). You see, she has never had a dog in the house. She's very selective about which dogs she likes. Now that she has Tenny, all she ever wants to do is hug, kiss, and play with her. Tenny is very sweet, although you get a sense that she would rather be napping than getting kisses.

This whole week has been a bit of a whirlwind with the new addition to our family, and it got me thinking: Why do we own pets? Companionship is probably near the top in terms of reasons. Maybe you just think pets are cool. Maybe we need them for a working reason, like a K-9 or therapy. Maybe you're a breeder?

I think there are a lot of parallels between pet ownership and working in emergency management, public safety, volunteer services, public health, and the like.

There's the camaraderie of it. Like a dog adopting us into their pack, we tend to work with the same folks over and over again, whether it be volunteering together, fighting fires together, working in an EOC together, or just meeting our friends at the FOP. or firehall. We have a professional pack.

We play together, too. Think of how many friends you've made through work, and how tight we all are? The softball leagues, the runs for charity, the fundraisers, the beef and beers, and blood drives. It feels like there's something every day, kind of like when Tenny drops her toy at my feet as soon as she's done her morning meal.

I can tell you one thing is certain: We certainly don't own a pet or work in public safety or public service for a life of luxury.

Here's my theory: We own pets, like we work in public safety and public service, because we want to do something bigger than ourselves. We consciously make a life choice to own a pet, walk them in the cold, spend money on them, and know that nothing lasts forever just like we consciously make a life choice to work the long hours of an emergency manager, fight the fires as a firefighter, walk the beat as a police officer, and give more than we get working for a non-profit.

That's why Tenny is so special. In just a few short days, she has evolved from a pet to a calling. That is incredibly powerful and enriching.

So, when the late-night call goes out for a deployment, the cell phone rings at 2:00 a.m., the EOC is activated for weeks on end, the flood waters rise instead of fall, or Tenny just won't stop barking because she sees a bird in the yard and you're on a Zoom call, remember this:

All of this is bigger than us. Sometimes, to rise above the stress and turmoil of the big moments, it's important to feel small every now and then.

### **New in Christ**

Romans 6:4-Therefore we are buried with him by baptism into death: that like as Christ was raised up from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life. (KJV)

The Christian identity begins at Baptism and is to be honored throughout life. Believers begin the new life in Christ at Holy Baptism and are forever changed. The identity change occurring at Baptism is permanent for life's remaining days. Serious Christians measure all thoughts and actions with Jesus Christ's teachings. The heart, mind and soul consciously guide the believer in following Jesus Christ.

2 Corinthians 5:17-Therefore if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new. (KJV)

Sin is resolutely rejected at Holy Baptism and afterwards is to be firmly avoided. When the believer becomes aware of committing sins,

repentance is necessary. Repentance and recommitment to Jesus Christ enable new beginnings to occur. Confession and Communion restore the desired unity with the Lord Jesus Christ. Revulsion of committing sins and desire to be with Christ will hasten repentance.

# Ephesians 4:24-And that ye put on the new man, which after God is created in righteousness and true holiness. (KJV)

Peace, love, and joy abound when unity with the Lord Jesus Christ is experienced. Holiness occurs when all that is of Christ is fully a part of every aspect of life. Temptations and perils to the soul exist to destroy the believer's faith in Christ. Serious believers ardently cherish and are grateful for Christ's boundless love. Holiness and righteousness are compelling thoughts for believers serious in Christ.

# Colossians 3:10-And have put on the new man, which is renewed in knowledge after the image of him that created him: (KJV)

Believers desiring to grow in Christ act to learn more from and about the Lord. The Creator of life and life are held dearly in the believer's heart and mind. Life emanates from Jesus Christ, exists in Christ and is directed toward Christ. The life in Christ is a great and wonderful mystery constantly being revealed. Attentive believers marvel at the Divine revelations occurring on a daily basis.

# Hebrews 10:20-By a new and living way, which he hath consecrated for us, through the veil, that is to say, his flesh; (KJV)

Partaking of Jesus Christ's Precious Body and Blood brings unity and new life. The Precious Body and Blood of Christi are available in each Divine Liturgy. Celebration of the Divine Liturgy creates newness of life for the community. Communities are lovingly transformed by the celebrations of the Divine Liturgy.
