

Giving Thanks Unto God Luke 2:38- And she coming in that instant gave thanks likewise unto the Lord,

The Holy Scriptures contain lessons in gratitude to the Lord God for out benefit. All that is good comes from the Lord God and merits expressions of gratitude. All the good done by humans occurs with energy provided by the Lord God. Believers recognizing the goodness of God have the opportunity to give thanks. Expressions of appreciation to God have a place in the grateful hearts of believers.

Luke 17:16- And fell down on his face at his feet, giving him thanks: and he was a Samaritan. (KJV)

Prayers are regularly directed to God by believers in times of need and difficulties. God may be viewed as a last resort and only hope when afflictions occur in life. Giving thanks to the Lord God is beneficial when the fervent prayers are answered. The Gospel is clear that not everyone that is healed by God takes time to say thanks. The relationship with God is confirmed when believers show gratitude to God.

I Corinthians 15:57- But thanks be to God, which giveth us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ. (KJV)

God is aware when individuals seek help in prayer and when thanks is given. God is aware of every thought and action of individuals and determines the outcome. God knows when the heart, mind and soul are grateful for Divine help and healings. When prayers are answered, the joyous opportunity to give thanks to God exists. Fervent prayers answered by God bring peace to the grateful heart, mind and soul.

2 Corinthians 9:11- Being enriched in everything to all bountifulness, which causeth through us thanksgiving to God. (KJV)

The most difficult moments in life are opportunities to be thankful to the Lord God. When difficulties arise in life, placing the focus on God reveals inherent goodness. Patience is necessary at times for God's goodness to be revealed to the believer. Faith and trust in the Lord God are important in the life in Christ throughout life. Fervent and centered prayers enable the believer to recognize God's goodness.

Ephesians 5:20- Giving thanks always for all things unto God and the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ; (KJV)

Believers do well to utilize the mind carefully in thinking about God's goodness. Giving thanks to God is a fundamental part of experiencing growth in Christ. The Lord Jesus Christ teaches gratitude to attentive believers willing to listen. The Divine services of the Church offer continuous opportunities to thank God. The Twenty Fourth Sunday after Pentecost Luke 8:41-56

And, behold, there came a man named Jairus, and he was a ruler of the synagogue: and he fell down at Jesus' feet, and besought him that he would come into his house: For he had one only daughter, about twelve years of age, and she lay a dying. But as he went the people thronged him. And a woman having an issue of blood twelve years, which had spent all her living upon physicians, neither could be healed of any, Came behind him, and touched the border of his garment: and immediately her issue of blood stanched. And Jesus said, Who touched me? When all denied, Peter and they that were with him said, Master, the multitude throng thee and press thee, and sayest thou, Who touched me? And Jesus said, Somebody hath touched me: for I perceive that virtue is gone out of me. And when the woman saw that she was not hid, she came trembling, and falling down before him, she declared unto him before all the people for what cause she had touched him, and how she was healed immediately. And he said unto her, Daughter, be of good comfort: thy faith hath made thee whole; go in peace. While he yet spake, there cometh one from the ruler of the synagogue's house, saying to him, Thy daughter is dead; trouble not the Master. But when Jesus heard it, he answered him, saying, Fear not: believe only, and she shall be made whole. And when he came into the

house, he suffered no man to go in, save Peter, and James, and John, and the father and the mother of the maiden. And all wept, and bewailed her: but he said, Weep not; she is not dead, but sleepeth. And they laughed him to scorn, knowing that she was dead. And he put them all out, and took her by the hand, and called, saying, Maid, arise. And her spirit came again, and she arose straightway: and he commanded to give her meat. And her parents were astonished: but he charged them that they should tell no man what was done. (KJV)

The Holy Gospel is proclaimed in each Divine Liturgy to nourish and unite believers with Jesus Christ. The Gospel reaches into the depths of receptive hearts, minds and souls.

God's Holy Church exists for believers to continuously experience the Lord Jesus Christ. Experiences will vary according to the degree of the person's faith and interest.

The present Gospel gives two vivid examples of the possibilities when strong faith and interest in Jesus Christ exist. Today's Gospel verifies the value of reaching out in faith to Jesus Christ.

The woman with the issue of blood for twelve years had spent her living seeking a cure from physicians. Her experience in seeking a cure without Jesus Christ was to no avail.

When the woman approached Jesus in faith, she was healed immediately. Jesus recognized and verified the value of the woman's faith. Persons hearing today's Gospel are challenged to honestly examine their degree of faith in Jesus Christ.

Jairus appealed to Jesus for the healing of his young daughter who was dying. Jairus was a person of authority in the synagogue. In his demeanor, Jairus demonstrated humility before Jesus by falling down before Him.

Time elapsed from the time Jairus left his house to go to see Jesus, His daughter died during that time. The devastating news of the daughter's death was not a deterrent to the Lord Jesus Christ.

Jesus Christ is the Conqueror of Death. Jesus Christ is the Giver and Restorer of Life. When the news of the girl's death arrived, Jesus told Jairus not to fear. Jesus told Jairus to believe.

Jesus went to Jairus' house and restored life to the young girl. The Holy Apostles Peter, James, and John in addition to Jairus and his wife were known witnesses recorded in the Gospel of this great life-giving miracle.

The present Gospel has been preserved down through the centuries in God's Holy Church. The healing of the woman with the issue of blood and the restoring of life to Jairus' daughter are intended to build up believers' lives in Jesus Christ.

The Church offers the life in Christ to all in the world willing to move away from sin and choose the way of Christ. The Church offers the nourishment, instruction, and the Holy Mysteries to experience the life in Christ and to sustain it.

Humility and repentance are essential in the life in Jesus Christ. Firm faith and belief in Christ are required. Jesus Christ offers hope and the avenue to the Kingdom of God at all times even when devastating news is received.

Twelve years of affliction did not deter the woman with the issue of blood from turning to Jesus. She reached out in faith. The woman's initiative and strong faith in Jesus Christ proved worthwhile.

Jairus did not turn away from Jesus when he heard his daughter had died. Jairus accompanied Jesus to his home in faith. Jesus Christ brought lasting joy to Jairus, his wife, and his daughter when the daughter was restored to life.

Listeners to the present Gospel choose whether to take the Gospel to heart and make it a part of their lives. The Divine Liturgy unites believers with Jesus Christ. The Gospel reading is an integral part of the unifying experience.

Each moment is an opportunity to live in Jesus Christ. During every element of time, a person can be united with Jesus Christ. Each person chooses whether to unite the heart, mind, and soul with Christ at every moment of life.

The world and evil challenge the believer at every instance. Temptations and perils exist to tarnish the soul and corrupt the heart and mind. Persons of strong and resolute faith turn to Jesus Christ for lifesustaining help.

Jairus and the woman with the issue of blood are two enduring examples for believers today to remain united with Jesus Christ. God's Holy Church proclaims this Gospel message each year because of the life-giving and life-sustaining value.



We're all busy, but we're not too busy to be kind, caring and patient. Remember the best thing you can give someone right now is love.


