The Church has arrived today at Meatfare Sunday also known as the Sunday of the Last Judgment. This is a day of transition for the believer's body, mind, and soul in preparation for the Lenten Journey.

Today is the last day for believers to eat meat until Pascha. Conscious awareness of the Lenten Journey is to increase at this time. Purification and care of the soul are to be at the forefront of the mind.

This Sunday focuses on daily personal relationships. Daily relationships and encounters with others determine where a believer will experience eternity.

The Lord Jesus Christ is identified with each person met in daily life.

Today's Gospel examines our experiences with strangers, the sick, the suffering, and the imprisoned. Christ's Second Coming and the Final Judgement will consider the way we treat strangers, the sick, the needy, and the imprisoned.

Today is a time for an honest personal assessment of our relationship with Jesus Christ. If we say we love Christ, we will demonstrate Christ's love in the way we live in the Church and the way we treat others in daily life.

Honoring the Lenten Journey enables believers to become more like Christ and to treat others in ways pleasing to Christ. Honoring the Great Fast is a conscious effort of rejecting sin in life and living in ways pleasing to Christ.

Honoring Great Lent intends to fill the believer's heart, mind, and soul with Christ. The food we eat, the thoughts we entertain, and the activities we engage in will determine if we are serious about loving and living in Jesus Christ.

The way we treat others determines how we will spend eternity. Now is the time to begin anew in Jesus Christ. Now is the time to treat others we meet in daily life with Christian love.

Today is the day to reject sin, repent, and center life in Christ. Today is the day to see Jesus Christ in each person we meet. God's goodness and mercy give the believer the constant ability to repent and to begin anew.

The Church offers Jesus Christ's welcoming embrace to persons rejecting the way of sin and seeking to repent. Great Lent fosters and encourages repentance, increased prayer, and fasting.

The Church provides nourishment and teachings to guide the believer from repentance to the Heavenly Kingdom. The Church is the foretaste of and is the centuries-old well-traveled road to the Kingdom.

Each day believers have the ability to live in Jesus Christ. Each relationship is an experience with Christ. Conscious use of the mind, heart, and soul determines the degree each moment of life focuses on Christ.

Great Lent has a specific structure each year to benefit believers in Christ. This Sunday and each of the forthcoming days until Pascha will enrich, renew, and strengthen participating believers in Christ.

Each moment offers renewal in Christ. Serious decision-making is necessary to pray and to embrace Christ. Each individual chooses the use and direction of the heart, mind, and soul.



The young woman who submitted the tech support message below (about her relationship to her husband) presumably did it as a joke. Then she got a reply that was way too good to keep to herself. The tech support people's love advice was hilarious and genius!

The query:

Dear Tech Support,

Last year I upgraded from Boyfriend 5.0 to Husband 1.0 and noticed a distinct slowdown in overall system performance, particularly in the flower and jewelry applications, which operated flawlessly under Boyfriend 5.0.

In addition, Husband 1.0 uninstalled many other valuable programs, such as Romance 9.5 and Personal Attention 6.5, and then installed undesirable programs such as: NBA 5.0, NFL 3.0 and Golf Clubs 4.1. Conversation 8.0 no longer runs, and House cleaning 2.6 simply crashes the system. Please note that I have tried running Nagging 5.3 to fix these problems, but to no avail.

What can I do?

The response (that came weeks later out of the blue)...

Dear Desperate,

First keep in mind, Boyfriend 5.0 is an Entertainment Package, while Husband 1.0 is an Operating System.

Please enter command: I thought you loved me.html and try to download Tears 6.2. Do not forget to install the Guilt 3.0 update. If that application works as designed, Husband 1.0 should then automatically run the applications Jewelry 2.0 and Flowers 3.5. However, remember, overuse of the Tears application can cause Husband 1.0 to default to Grumpy Silence 2.5, Happy Hour 7.0, or Beer 6.1. Please note that Beer 6.1 is a very bad program that will download the Snoring Loudly Beta version.

Whatever you do, DO NOT, under any circumstances, install Mother-In-Law 1.0 as it runs a virus in the background that will eventually seize control of all your system resources.

In addition, please do not attempt to re-install the Boyfriend 5.0 program. These are unsupported applications and will crash Husband 1.0.

In summary, Husband 1.0 is a great program, but it does have limited memory and cannot learn new applications quickly. You might consider buying additional software to improve memory and performance. We recommend Cooking 3.0.




I Peter 4:16- Yet if any man suffer as a Christian, let him not be ashamed; but let him glorify God on this behalf. (KJV)

has received, as the teachers have dogmatized, as the universe has agreed, as Grace has shown forth, as Truth has revealed, as falsehood has been dissolved, as Wisdom has presented, as Christ has awarded: thus we declare, thus we assert, thus we preach Christ, our true God, and honor His Saints in words, in writings, in thoughts, in sacrifices, in churches, in Holy Icons; on the one hand worshiping and reverencing Christ as God and Lord; and on the other hand honoring as true servants of the same Lord of all, and accordingly offering them veneration. This is the Faith of the Apostles; this is the Faith of the Fathers; this is the Faith of the Orthodox; this is the Faith which has established the universe!"
