The holy God-pleasers tell us that in the last times there will be no monasticism at all; it may survive in a few places in its external aspect, but without genuine monastic activity. Those seeking the Kingdom of Heaven will not have any of their own podvigs (askeses, spiritual struggles, or exploits). They will save themselves only through endurance of sorrows and illness. Why will there be no podvigs? Because people will lack humility. *Abbot Nikon Vorobiev,* Abbot Nikon Letters to Spiritual Children p.151

Then cometh He to a city of Samaria, which is called Sychar, near to the parcel of ground that Jacob gave to his son Joseph. Now Jacob's well was there. Jesus therefore, being wearied with His journey, sat thus on the well: and it was about the sixth hour. There cometh a woman of Samaria to draw water: Jesus saith unto her, Give me to drink. (For His disciples were gone away unto the city to buy meat.) Then saith the woman of Samaria unto Him, How is it that thou, being a Jew, askest drink of me, which am a woman of Samaria? for the Jews have no dealings with the Samaritans. Jesus answered and said unto her, If thou knewest the gift of God, and who it is that saith to thee, Give me to drink; thou wouldest have asked of Him, and He would have given thee living water. The woman saith unto Him, Sir, thou hast nothing to draw with, and the well is deep: from whence then hast Thou that living water? Art Thou greater than our father Jacob, which gave us the well, and drank thereof himself, and his children, and his cattle? Jesus answered and said unto her, Whosoever drinketh of this water shall thirst again: But whosoever drinketh of the water that I shall give him shall never thirst; but the water that I shall give him shall be in him a well of water springing up into everlasting life. The woman saith unto Him, Sir, give me this water, that I thirst not, neither come hither to draw. Jesus saith unto her, Go, call thy husband, and come hither. The woman answered and said, I have no husband. Jesus said unto her, Thou hast well said, I have no husband: For thou hast had five husbands; and he whom thou now hast is not thy husband: in that saidst thou truly. The woman saith unto Him, Sir, I perceive that thou art a prophet. Our fathers worshipped in this mountain; and ye say, that in Jerusalem is the place where men ought to worship. Jesus saith unto her, Woman, believe me, the hour cometh, when ye shall neither in this mountain, nor yet at Jerusalem, worship the Father. Ye worship ye know not what: we know what we worship: for salvation is of the Jews. But the hour cometh, and now is, when the true worshippers shall worship the Father in spirit and in truth: for the Father seeketh such to worship Him. God is a Spirit: and they that worship Him must worship Him in spirit and in truth. The woman saith unto Him, I know that Messias cometh, which is called Christ: when He is come, He will tell us all things. Jesus saith unto her, I that speak unto thee am He. And upon this came His disciples, and marvelled that He talked with the woman: yet no man said, What seekest thou? or, Why talkest thou with her? The woman then left her waterpot, and went her way into the city, and saith to the men, Come, see a man, which told me all things that ever I did: is not this the Christ? Then they went out of the city, and came unto Him. In the mean while His disciples prayed Him, saying, Master, eat. But He said unto them, I have meat to eat that ye know not of. Therefore said the disciples one to another, Hath any man brought Him

ought to eat? Jesus saith unto them, My meat is to do the will of Him that sent me, and to finish His work. Say not ye, There are yet four months, and then cometh harvest? behold, I say unto you, Lift up your eyes, and look on the fields; for they are white already to harvest. And he that reapeth receiveth wages, and gathereth fruit unto life eternal: that both he that soweth and he that reapeth may rejoice together. And herein is that saying true, One soweth, and another reapeth. I sent you to reap that whereon ye bestowed no labour: other men laboured, and ye are entered into their labours. And many of the Samaritans of that city believed on him for the saying of the woman, which testified, He told me all that ever I did. So when the Samaritans were come unto Him, they besought Him that He would tarry with them: and He abode there two days. And many more believed because of his own word; And said unto the woman, Now we believe, not because of thy saying: for we have heard Him ourselves, and know that this is indeed the Christ, the Saviour of the world. God's Holy Church preserves, protects and proclaims the conversation between the Lord Jesus Christ and the Samaritan woman in the Gospel. The Church wants believers to know of the Living Water of which Jesus spoke.

Jesus said the Living Water would be a well springing to everlasting life. Jesus offers the water that will quench the thirst of the believer's soul. Jesus offers the Living Water uniquely identified with and available from the Savior of the world.

Today's Gospel identifies Jesus Christ as the Savior of the world. Jesus stands through the centuries offering salvation for believers choosing to confess and follow Him. Jesus receives persons willing to repent of their sins and come to Him.

Jesus Christ went to the Cross as a demonstration of love for all. Jesus rose from the Tomb demonstrating victory over death and the possibility of eternal life.

God's Holy Church continues to celebrate Jesus' Resurrection.

The Church proclaims the Gospel of the Samaritan Woman every year to educate and remind believers of the Living Water. The Church encourages believers to drink from the Lord Jesus Christ unto everlasting life.

The world makes various offers to draw believers away from Christ and the path to eternal life. The world attempts to offer nourishment for the thirst of the soul. Only in Jesus Christ does the soul find complete satisfaction and peace. Only in and through Jesus Christ does the believer experience the fulness of life and life eternal. Only in Jesus Christ does boundless love, mercy and forgiveness exist for each person.

The Resurrected Christ offers hope, joy and peace prevailing in all circumstance of life. The Lord Jesus Christ offers complete healing for the ravaged soul. The Lord Jesus Christ welcomes and transforms persons choosing to repent.

The Resurrected Christ makes all things new. Believers seriously following Jesus Christ experience newness throughout life. (2 Cor, 5:17) Believers in Jesus Christ move from glory to glory as well—described by the Holy Apostle Paul. (2 Cor. 3:18)

The Church is currently fully celebrating Jesus Christ's Resurrection. Each believer, every family, and every parish share in the Resurrection joy. Jesus Christ provides joy that permeates and endures through the centuries.

<u>Eternal Life</u>

Matthew 19:16- And, behold, one came and said unto him, Good Master, what good thing shall I do, that I may have eternal life? (KJV)

The Kingdom of God and eternal life are the ultimate goals pursued by believers. Remaining faithful to the Lord God is essential in seeking the Heavenly Kingdom. Repentance is necessary throughout life to remain on the narrow path. (Mt.7:13-14) Joy exists in faithfully living in Christ from

Baptism until departure from this life. The Lord's love, mercy, and forgiveness enable the believer to experience joy.

Mark 10:30- But he shall receive an hundredfold now in this time, houses, and brethren, and sisters, and mothers, and children, and lands, with persecutions; and in the world to come eternal life. (KJV)

The commitment to follow Jesus Christ as King and as God begins at Baptism. Faithfulness to Christ is to continue throughout the remaining days of earthly life. Holy Confession and Communion enable believers to maintain union with Christ. The hunger in the soul motivates believers to desire continued union with Jesus. Joy arises when the believer is forgiven and receives Jesus' Body and Blood.

John 6:68- Then Simon Peter answered him, Lord, to whom shall we go? thou hast the words of eternal life. (KJV)

God's Holy Church preserves, protects and proclaims Jesus' words of eternal life. Faithful believers cherish hearing Jesus Christ's words from the Holy Gospel.
