

Orthodox Christian Catacombs THE POWER OF THE PROSKOMIDIA PRAYERS

There was a young couple in Greece in the 1940s. They had only been married for 6 months.

The young man was a miner, and there was a terrible accident in the mine. Everyone got out, except him. Back then they did not have the equipment to be able to excavate quickly.

So the foreman went to the young bride & told her "We are very sorry. But by the time we dig through, it will probably take about a month, and your husband will definitely be dead by then. The area is so small...no food, no light, no water. Nothing to help him survive."

So she did what a good wife would do. She did the σαράντα-Λειτουργο, where she had the priest serve Liturgies for 40 days for her husband's soul. And every day she would go to church and she would light a candle for her husband. And she would give a Phosphora and wine to the priest. This went on for 37 days. And the end of the 37th Liturgy, an old woman came to the church from a village about a day and a half away, and said to the priest, "Father, we need you. We don't have a priest and someone is about to die."

So the priest turned to the young bride and told her, "I'm sorry. We are going to have to stop at 37 days. There is an emergency I have to attend to & I will need to leave."


Well, on the 40th day, the mine workers broke through the collapsed mine. And they discovered the young man still alive! Everybody was amazed! "How can you still be living?" The young man said, "Brothers, I cannot explain it. But at a certain time in the morning I received a candle, some wine & some bread. But during the last 3 days none of those things happened & I felt that as if I was going to die."

The prayers of the Church saved him... The Proskomidia prayers. And that old woman...that was the Devil. He could see what was going on, and he did not want that young man to live.

Prayer has great power.

The most powerful prayer is the Proskomedia. When the priest takes a piece of the offered bread, the Prosforo, puts it on the paten....and that piece represents us.

Sister Vassa [Larin]: THE DATE OF MY FATHER'S DEATH, JULY 5

My father died on July 5, a date that had no particular significance in my family, as far as we knew, - until soon after he died. In the final week of his life, when dad was dying in the hospice care center, we half-expected him to pass away on July 2, which is the day of the repose of his beloved mentor, St. John of Shanghai. But dad hung on until the first few minutes of July 5, and breathed his last shortly after midnight: he suddenly coughed, then let out what sounded like a burp, and stopped breathing. I happened to be there, sleeping on the couch next to his bed, with my mom, who had stayed awake in the reclining chair next to the bed, and who woke me up shortly before the nurse called the time of death, 12:10 am. I read the prayer of St. Simeon (Now You let Your servant go, O Master, in peace...) in Slavonic, sang the Paschal Stichera (Let God arise), then mom told me to shut up because we had to call people.

My father's side of the family lives in Australia, where dad lived in his teens and twenties. I don't know who informed them that he had died, but here's what we learned about July 5, when the family in Australia was notified: It was the very day, last year, when my father's only brother, Serafim Larin, died. We didn't know this, because the two brothers had been estranged since 2007 when our church (the ROCOR) entered into communion with the Moscow Patriarchate. Uncle Serafim was against this, while my dad, who was initially against it but got on board with it after Metropolitan Laurus did, supported it. The two brothers tried talking about it, but stopped talking after a while. I know this weighed heavily on my father, although he never talked about it.

Many families in my church were divided in this way, which is why I am sharing this story. I think it has a sort of happy ending. The two brothers died on the same day. Call me superstitious, but I think it's hard *not* to see a sign here, of them being brought together in the end that has no end. And of God's merciful perspective on our divisions in this life: it is He Who has all the power over our life and death, and He alone Who has the power to bring us together, in the end, even while He suffers our divisions in this life. Glory be to Him, and may my dad and his beloved brother rest in peace, in the Heavenly Kingdom.
