Dear brothers and sisters,

In churches and monasteries, as well as in any Orthodox family, every meal is necessarily blessed with prayer and sprinkled with holy water.

Unfortunately, even in quite church-oriented families, people do not always understand why this is so essential. They consider it a relic of the past and religious fanaticism.

But today we will explain why this is so important and what terrible danger unblessed food can pose, even if it's prepared at home. The first and perhaps most well-known reason we pray before and after meals is to thank God. The Lord gives us food and the means to purchase it. He does not allow us to starve, and although we may not know what food scarcity is like, if we simply imagine ourselves as residents of some African tribe where food is very scarce, it becomes clear why we must thank God.

Because we do not know what will happen to us tomorrow. What trials await us? There are many cases where successful, quite wealthy people end up on the streets, becoming beggars. Thus, what we have on our table is a gift from God; it is His mercy, and we must thank Him for everything He gives us and appreciate it.

The second reason we must pray is related to spiritual laws and the dangers that await us if we do not seek God's help and protection. In short, the Lord created the entire world. Now imagine the power of a bad, evil word.

We buy bread, dairy, and meat products and prepare meals for our loved ones, children, and guests. But can you be sure of the people who processed, cut, packaged, and arranged the meat on the store shelves? Are you sure that they bring only good and love with their words and thoughts? That they did not curse, quarrel, insult one another, or curse anyone while handling the food?

Such negative behavior and anger around your kitchen or in a cafe turn the food into poison. As the holy fathers wrote, from such food, one can even become ill. In books describing the lives of ancient monasteries, you may find stories about how even the slightest conflict among monks during meal preparation would lead the abbot to prohibit that food from being served, calling it poison and instructing them to cook again.

Just a small conflict already carries a spirit of contention. Now imagine what is happening with our food today when curses, insults, and hatred toward one's neighbors have become the norm. Picture the terrible influence this has on the products we buy and use to cook at home.

How do we remove this influence from our food? Very simply. When we bring groceries from the store or market, be sure to cross-sprinkle them with holy water while praying in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Also, always pray before meals. In your prayer, ask the Lord to bless and cleanse the food. Furthermore, prayer helps us eat mindfully. We should not behave like animals, indiscriminately consuming everything to fill our stomachs without prayer.

We must refrain from food that is not beneficial, controlling our passionate appetites. In general, the holy fathers emphasize that food should be taken like medicine. We should not seek excessive pleasure in food, looking for exotic dishes or extraordinary ingredients, etc.

Food should be simple, healthy, and satisfying. Then we will not fall into sin by overeating or seeking out expensive restaurants to taste some exotic dish, treating food as something extraordinary or special.

In such cases, food becomes poison for both the body and the soul. It becomes an idol for us because it is no longer healthy but a sinful passion. We eat not for pleasure but to have the strength to work and live. Everything else is our passion for tasty, sweet, or exotic food—essentially, a sinful addiction.

That's why it's important to pray before meals, asking the Lord to guard our hearts and minds from demonic passions regarding food. At the same time, it is crucial that the prayer is conscious, not just recited like some mantra. We must understand what and who we are asking for when we pray. The Lord is alive; He sees our hearts and thoughts.

So if you truly want your food not to be poison for you and your loved ones, pray attentively and consciously, with gratitude to God and reverence. Such a prayer will cleanse your meal from demonic influence and help you relate to food properly, so as not to harm your body or soul.

This is why it is so important to do everything with prayer, including eating. This is not just a tradition or religious fanaticism but a necessity. Our grandparents always knew this, which is why they worked and ate with prayer, waking and falling asleep with prayer.

This is a spiritual law: if the Lord and His commandments are at the center of your life and daily affairs, everything will go well and for the good.

If, however, we rely on ourselves and our strength, the devil easily breaks our lives apart, destroys families, corrupts children, and leads us into sin and passions. For we cannot achieve anything worthwhile without God, and until we understand this, we will repeatedly fall and make mistakes.

This also applies to food: pray before meals, sprinkle your food with holy water, and eat with gratitude to God, and such food will never be poison for you, neither for your body nor for your soul.

Only with Christ's help, guidance, and grace, do truth and love remain inseparable. Having Jesus Christ foremost in heart, mind and soul keeps love and truth united. Evil is present in society and vigilance is required to practice truth with love. Believers need to nourish the heart, mind and soul to combat the presence of evil.

John 1:4- I have no greater joy than to hear that my children walk in truth. (KJV)

Sunday after the Exaltation of the Precious Life-giving Cross Mark

8:34-9:1

When He had called the people to Himself, with His disciples also, He said to them, "Whoever desires to come after Me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross, and follow Me. For whoever desires to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for My sake and the gospel's will save it. For what will it profit a man if he gains the whole world, and loses his own soul? Or what will a man give in exchange for his soul? For whoever is ashamed of Me and My words in this adulterous and sinful generation, of him the Son of Man also will be ashamed when He comes in the glory of His Father with the holy angels. Each person is invited to the feast at each Divine Liturgy. At the Divine Liturgy, believers unite with and experience Jesus Christ by partaking of His Precious Body and Blood.

Many individuals decline the invitation to participate in the feast at each Divine Liturgy. Excuses are often rendered as to why church is not attended. Reasons are fabricated to not participate in Communion.

Jesus' love and patience are immeasurable and enduring. Jesus continues to invite individuals in each century. Jesus Christ continues to be alive in God's Holy Church.

Jesus welcomes individuals seeking to repent of their sins. Believers that once opposed the Church are welcome to repent and return. The Church is not only for people facing an emergency in their personal circumstances.

The Church is for life, all of life, from conception to eternal life. Life's meaning is defined and understood within Jesus Christ. Jesus Christ is the way to the Divine Kingdom and eternal life.

The passing centuries has not resulted in the cancelling of the invitation to draw near to Jesus Christ. Jesus' arms are outstretched to welcome each person courageous enough to answer "yes" to the invitation to draw near.

The hunger in the soul is authentically nourished in Christ. The Gospel and the Precious Body and Blood of Christ nourish the heart, mind, and soul. The Church offers each person all that is needed in life. Efforts to feed the soul on other than Jesus Christ leads to dissatisfaction. Worldly efforts to feed the soul are artificial substitutes. They are inadequate and are soon exposed.



We should go to the Liturgy even if we stand there like logs. Someone might say: "I'm not what I should be, I don't understand anything there, I can't concentrate." But go as you are. An elder says: "When you enter a perfumery and then leave, your clothes will smell nice, even if you didn't want them to, even if you didn't buy anything." He says the same thing happens when you go to the Liturgy.

Maybe you couldn't do anything spiritual, but it's already something that you went, that you stood there like a log. So tell yourself: "I am going as I am—an unpolished log. Because God can work with an unpolished log." And if you don't go because you say, "I can't concentrate," things will get worse and worse, and you will never improve.
