Zacchaeus Sunday Luke 19:1-10

And Jesus entered and passed through Jericho. And, behold, there was a man named Zacchaeus, which was the chief among the publicans, and he was rich. And he sought to see Jesus who he was; and could not for the press, because he was little of stature. And he ran before, and climbed up into a sycamore tree to see him: for he was to pass that way. And when Jesus came to the place, he looked up, and saw him, and said unto him, Zacchaeus, make haste, and come down; for today I must abide at thy house. And he made haste, and came down, and received him joyfully. And when they saw it, they all murmured, saying, That he was gone to be guest with a man that is a sinner. And Zacchaeus stood, and said unto the Lord: Behold, Lord, the half of my goods I give to the poor; and if I have taken anything from any man by false accusation, I restore him fourfold. And Jesus said unto him, This day is salvation come to this house, forsomuch as he also is a son of Abraham. For the Son of man is come to seek and to save that which was lost. (KJV)

The arrival of Zacchaeus Sunday on the Church's calendar is a wakeup call for believers to ready themselves for the approach of Great Lent. Now is the time to turn attention to the condition of the soul.

Today is a moment to think about the need for repentance throughout earthly life. Great Lent offers the structure, inspiration, and guidance for compete, honest, and sincere repentance.

Believers exit the Baptismal font united with the Lord Jesus Christ. The journey to the Kingdom of God can be very long. The journey to the Kingdom is filled with dangers, temptations, and perils to the soul.

The Church offers the nourishment and guidance for believers to travel the narrow path to the Kingdom. Repentance is essential throughout life. Believers are constantly challenged to remain faithfully on the road to the Kingdom.

Repentance enables the believer to unite and reunite with Jesus Christ when wayward paths are taken. Immeasurable joy in Jesus Christ is experienced at Baptism. Immeasurable joy occurs when a believer repents.

Zacchaeus is an excellent example of repentance. He put forth considerable effort to see and approach Christ. He gave of his wealth to the poor. He restored bountifully to those he deceived.

Jesus' love, care, and forgiveness are evident in the life of Zacchaeus. Jesus Visited Zacchaeus' house. Jesus plainly said salvation came to the house. The Gospel states clearly Jesus came to seek and to save the lost.

Each believer is lost to a certain degree. Personal knowledge about Jesus Christ falls short of the full nature and glory of Christ. Personal efforts to follow Jesus Christ always entails a certain amount of sin that needs removed.

The Gospel account of Zacchaeus assures believers of Jesus' love for sinners willing to repent. Zacchaeus's actions open an avenue of hope for believers seeking to unite and reunite with Christ.

Each person has issues in life. Each person discovers personal sins when honest assessments are made of the heart, mind, and soul. Keeping the condition of the soul in focus throughout life is of utmost importance.

The soul's importance cannot be overestimated. Only through Jesus Christ can purity come to the soul. Only through forgiveness and the love of Christ can the believer travel the path to God's Kingdom and eternal life.

Daily life in the home and in the community challenges the believer to live in purity. Perils to the soul occur in relationships in the home and in the community.

Temptations occur everywhere.

Greed, anger, and ungodly thoughts arise and affect the heart, mind, and soul.

God's Holy Church offers the teachings and nourishment to address temptations, dangers, and perils to the soul.

Zacchaeus is one example of repentance. The Church offers countless examples of repentance in the lives of the saints and martyrs through the centuries.

Being attentive to the teachings of the Church strengthens believers' faithfulness.

Faithfulness to Christ inspires believers to ward off and repel dangers to the soul. Zacchaeus showed by his climbing of the tree the willingness to put forth effort to draw near to Christ.

Living in Jesus Christ requires effort throughout life. Effort is needed to go to church regularly during the year. Expending energy is essential to live according to the teachings of the Church.



Righteousness

Matthew 3:15-And Jesus answering said unto him, Suffer it to be so now: for thus it becometh us to fulfil all righteousness. Then he suffered him. (KJV)

Righteousness is referenced in several different places in St. Matthew's Gospel. Believers on the journey to the Kingdom of God do well to consider righteousness. Righteousness is prominent in the growth of serious believers in the Christian life. Believers are expected to actively pursue growth in Jesus Christ throughout life.

Matthew 5:6-Blessed are they which do hunger and thirst after righteousness: for they shall be filled. (KJV)

The Beatitudes proclaimed at the Divine Liturgy always reference righteousness. Each Divine Liturgy is an active prayer as well as a new learning experience. Believers benefit from being attentive to and learning from the Divine Liturgy. Participation in the Divine Liturgy is an intended active life-changing experience. The hunger in the soul yearns for righteousness in celebrating the Divine Liturgy.

Matthew 5:10-Blessed are they which are persecuted for righteousness' sake: for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. (KJV)

Righteousness comes through living in Christ and repelling all that is not of Christ. The believer is changed by Christ as the believer conforms to Christ's teachings. Believers are expected to actively adhere to and learn from Christ's teachings. The Church offers Christ's teachings to the believer throughout earthly life. Adhering to Jesus Christ's teachings includes suffering for Christ at times in life.

Matthew 5:20-For I say unto you, That except your righteousness shall exceed the righteousness of the scribes and Pharisees, ye shall in no case enter into the kingdom of heaven. (KJV)

Following Christ does not exempt a believer from experiencing the crosses in life. The Lord Jesus Christ established the lasting example of how to deal life's crosses. Believers benefit from constantly evaluating the state of personal growth in Christ. The Holy Gospel helps believers to measure and assess personal growth in Christ. The Gospel can be used to measure personal growth in Christ and spur repentance.

Matthew 6:33-But seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you. (KJV)

Stagnancy in the Christian life denies the believer the full opportunities of life. The journey from the Baptismal font to God's Kingdom requires earnest effort. Sin needs to be repelled and the righteousness of the Gospel actively embraced. Christ's love manifests in the believer choosing to actively live in Jesus Christ. Righteousness is a primary Christian goal throughout the journey of earthly life.

The Sunday of the Publican and Pharisee Luke 18:10-14

Two men went up into the temple to pray; the one a Pharisee, and the other a publican. The Pharisee stood and prayed thus with himself, God, I thank thee, that I am not as other men are, extortioners, unjust, adulterers, or even as this publican. I fast twice in the week, I give tithes of all that I possess. And the publican, standing afar off, would not lift up so much as his eyes unto heaven, but smote upon his breast, saying, God be merciful to me a sinner. I tell you, this man went down to his house justified rather than the other: for every one that exalteth himself shall be abased; and he that humbleth himself shall be exalted. (KJV)

The current Gospel is a lesson in the benefit of humility. The publican recognized his personal sinfulness and acknowledged it before the Lord. The publican did not praise his own goodness. He sought God's mercy.

Today is a time for honest personal self-examination. Now is the time to accurately judge and acknowledge personal sinfulness before the Lord. Great Lent is approaching. It is time to improve the condition of the soul.

Caring for the soul and seeking purity of the soul is a life-long necessity. Sinfulness enters daily life and must be fiercely addressed. The Lord God is present to help believers cleanse personal sins.

The publican is a lasting example of how to turn to the Lord and seek forgiveness. The Pharisee is an example of what not to do. The Pharisee focused on what he considered his goodness. He did not see his own sins.

Believers grow in Christ when seeing and taking responsibility for their personal sins. Growth in Jesus Christ is unlimited for those willing to vigorously root out and repel personal sin.

God's Holy Church proclaims the Gospel of the Publican and the Pharisee each year for believers to think carefully about personal sin. The soul benefits from the forgiveness possible in the Lord Jesus Christ.

Jesus Christ welcomes believers seriously seeking forgiveness of personal sins. Jesus Christ is present to forgive and blot out personal sins. Jesus Christ will cleanse and brighten the soul.

The Pharisee had a high opinion of himself. He was blinded to his own shortcomings. The Pharisee did not see sinfulness as a part of his life. He looked down on others including the Publican.

Each believer has sufficient work to do on his or her-self. Believers do not benefit by judging others or comparing themselves to others. The standards for the Christian life are clear in Jesus Christ and in Christ's teachings.

The lives of the saints and martyrs demonstrate the value of personal humility and waging war against personal sin. Wise believers heed the lessons of the present Gospel. Wise believers honestly seek to root out personal sin.

The Gospel shines light on the condition of each soul. Jesus Christ shines through the Gospel to each heart, mind, and soul. God's Holy Church offers the loving environment for cleansing of the soul.

Mindful believers heed the content of the Gospel. Attentive believers apply the Gospel to personal life and seek to grow in Christ. Jesus Christ's Light and Life shines through the Gospel to those with eyes to see and ears to hear.

Each Divine Liturgy is an opportunity to grow in Jesus Christ. Each Divine Liturgy is a direct experience with Jesus Christ. The Gospel provides Divine nourishment for each heart, mind, and soul.

Hearers of the Gospel of the Publican and the Pharisee respond in their individual ways. Adhering to and following the teachings of Jesus Christ rests within each heart, mind, and soul.

God's Holy Church proclaims the Gospel for the benefit of all willing to listen. Peace and joy await willing listeners to the Gospel. Fullness in life and eternal life await those heeding the Gospel teachings.

Thank God for the humility and honesty of the Publican. Thank God for the Church proclaiming the Gospel. Now is the time to seriously pray for God's mercy and forgiveness.

Thank God for mercy being available to sinners. Thank God for the opportunity to repent of sins and be renewed in Jesus Christ. Each moment is an opportunity to repent and begin anew in Christ.

Each Divine Liturgy offers newness and growth in Jesus Christ. The Church stands against the wiles of the devil and the evil of the world. The Church offers God's goodness, mercy, and forgiveness.

The time of life comes only once. Moments of life are not repeated. Believers choose whether to willingly live the life in Christ. Sinfulness has no place in the life in Christ.

Each believer embraces Jesus Christ at Baptism. Following Jesus Christ is intended for the time remaining in life after exiting the Baptismal font. It is always timely to repent of sin to follow Jesus Christ.


